


Ten Years of Negativity

Yearly Averages




Personal Economic Indicators Are Heading the Wrong Way






Where You Stand Depends on Where You Sleep







But it's Not a Priority for Spending

Given the deficit, what should be priorities for federal spending this year?

- 60% Fund veteran's health care
- 59% **Prep/response to health problems/injuries from disasters or terrorist attacks**
- 58% Increase research for cures/ treatments for major disease threats
- 52% Prevent spread of infectious diseases, including providing vaccinations
- 51% **Prevent chronic illnesses, such as heart disease, cancer and diabetes**
- 47% Ensure safety/effectiveness of prescription drugs
- 40% Provide screening tests for major health problems
- 36% Detect/prevent foodborne illnesses
- 36% Prevent spread of HIV/AIDS
- 34% Funding to hospitals for free/subsidized care to people without insurance
- 33% Ensure workplace safety
- 31% Funding to state public health departments
- 26% Reduce smoking and tobacco use
- 26% Reduce obesity by promoting healthy lifestyles
- 17% Prevent injuries, such as burns, poisoning and falls



52% oppose the idea of prohibiting restaurants from using trans fats.¹




70% oppose having a New York-style "ban" on sales of large sodas in their town.²
