

## FLOOR ALERT: VOTE NO ON AB 984

**AB 984 puts domestic violence survivors and LGBTQ teens at risk.** It allows GPS surveillance trackers in license plates, which can be used by abusers to track domestic violence survivors or unsupportive parents to see if their teen has gone to the local LGBTQ Center. Vulnerable people may not know how to disable the GPS tracker or fear the consequences of doing so.

**AB 984 puts California's status as a sanctuary state for abortions at risk.** A passenger in a Lyft car or a friend's vehicle who gets picked up at the airport and taken directly to Planned Parenthood may not know that the car they're in has a tracker that could provide evidence against them in a case about traveling here for an abortion against their state's anti-reproductive justice laws.

**AB 984 puts undocumented Californians at risk.** ICE could use the GPS surveillance technology to locate undocumented immigrants, as ICE has similarly used license plate readers (ALPRs) to track undocumented immigrants.

**AB 984 authorizes ticketing Californians who have properly registered their vehicle** if the technology fails through no fault of their own.

**AB 984 allows Californians to be tracked at all times, even if they are not driving.** Because the bill does not limit GPS tracking, any mobile app that is part of the digital vehicle registration device could track Californians whenever they have their cell phones on them – even if they're not in a car.

## AB 984 could be amended to drop all opposition by prohibiting GPS trackers in digital license plates for private cars – and the sponsor already sells a product without GPS trackers.
