The FTC CARS Rule and the FTC REDO Act

SUPPORT the FTC CARS Rule and OPPOSE the FTC REDO Act.

The <u>CARS Rule</u> (Combating Auto Retail Scams) was proposed in July 2022 and finalized in December 2023. No Congressional Review Act has been filed, but the auto dealer lobby has worked to introduce the FTC REDO Act, which would stop the CARS Rule from becoming law and hinder the FTC from issuing future auto dealer rules.

Why do we need the FTC CARS Rule?

Talking Points for the FTC CARS Rule

Auto Financing is Opaque and Inequitable

Consumers spend hours and hours just trying to learn the price of a car. Consumers spend an average of 15 hours on a car purchase, including several hours just to get the final, "out the door" price of the car.

Financing a car is expensive and complex, and many consumers are confused by the process. Auto is the largest source of non-mortgage consumer debt in the United States, and the cost of cars has risen dramatically in recent years. In the negotiations, dealers often focus on monthly payment amounts rather than the total price, which can be misleading about how expensive the transaction will be.

Junk fees in auto sales disproportionately harm consumers in historically marginalized communities. The FTC has brought numerous enforcement actions against dealers who have harmed Black, Hispanic and Native American consumers with unfair and deceptive junk fee practices (see page 4-5 of FAQ's), and research has revealed how dealers impose higher add-on prices to Black and Hispanic consumers.

Military servicemembers are frequently targeted by unethical dealers. Young servicemembers who need a car on base are a prime target for dishonest dealers, and the vast majority (over 79%) of military counselors have reported handling auto dealer complaints.

What does the rule do?

REQUIRES DEALERS TO:

Offering Price

Provide the honest price of the car up front to consumers

Monthly Payment Comparison

Tell consumers when lower monthly payments mean a higher price

Total of Payments

Tell consumers the full cost of the car, rather than focusing on monthly payments

BANS DEALERS FROM:

Scamming Military Servicemembers

Lying about their affiliation with the military or other government agencies

Junk Fees

Selling add-ons that provide zero benefits

Hidden Charges

Charging for any item without express informed consent

What does the FTC REDO Act do?

The REDO Act would undermine the FTC's authority to adopt **any rule** that regulates car dealers.

- Would stop the CARS Rule
- Would add in numerous steps to future
 FTC auto dealer rulemaking that only slow down the process

FTC REDO Act One-Pager

OPPOSE THE FTC REDO ACT S 3014 Consumer Advocacy Week A

The FTC REDO Act would STOP the FTC's CARS rule from becoming law.

This means the Act would **STOP** efforts to require up-front and honest car pricing and **STOP** efforts to rein in junk fees in car sales.

The FTC REDO Act RESTRICTS the ability of the FTC to help car buyers by inserting numerous unnecessary hurdles to the process of issuing a rule to regulate deceptive car dealers.

TELL CONGRESS TO REJECT THE FTC REDO ACT AND SUPPORT CAR BUYERS.
