Dear Acting Director Vought and Secretary Bessent:

We write with deep concern about the incursion of members of Elon Musk's "Department of Government Efficiency" (DOGE) into the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) and your illegal orders to stop its work.¹ Dismantling this law enforcement agency has long been a priority of the big financial institutions it was created to regulate, and this effort to seize control of the CFPB's inner workings is the clearest example yet that President Trump is willing to reward the billionaires who backed him, even at the expense of ordinary Americans.² We beat back all prior efforts to gut this agency, and we will fight this latest attack in Congress, the courts, and the public. It will fail.

Congress created the CFPB in response to the 2008 financial crisis through the bipartisan *Dodd Frank Act*.³ Since its founding, the agency has returned over \$21 billion to millions of consumers scammed out of their money, including returning hundreds of millions of dollars to veterans, seniors, and student borrowers cheated by predatory lenders.⁴ The CFPB is the primary government agency working to stop unfair debanking,⁵ protecting consumers from mortgage fraud,⁶ and cracking down on exploitative junk fees—saving Americans billions of dollars a year.⁷

On the evening of Thursday, February 6th, at least three of Musk’s employees entered CFPB headquarters and requested access to sensitive CFPB information, including internal staff records, competitive industry data, and personally identifiable consumer information.⁸ The release of this data to inexperienced, untrained, and unvetted employees raises serious concerns about its impact on law enforcement, consumer privacy, and the protection of confidential supervisory information of the nation’s biggest financial institutions, while “stoking fears that Musk will try to virtually dismantle the agency to the extent possible.”⁹ It also “raises uncomfortable questions if Musk’s company X launches a payments system as the CFPB has data on competitors such as Cash App.”¹⁰

DOGE’s incursion into the CFPB follows Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent’s order on February 3rd directing CFPB employees to freeze all rulemakings, litigation and enforcement activities, and external communications “unless expressly approved by the Acting Director or required by law.”¹¹ On February 8th, Acting Director Vought expanded the stop work order to include monitoring big banks, predatory lenders, and other financial services firms for illegal activity.¹² He also declined to accept scheduled funding for the CFPB.¹³ On February 9th, the agency’s headquarters were temporarily closed,¹⁴ and on February 10th Acting Director Vought ordered all CFPB staff to “not perform any work tasks.”¹⁵

The Trump Administration has effectively fired the financial cop on the beat and declared open season for predatory lenders and scam artists working to steal Americans' money and threaten their financial security. No matter how badly someone has been cheated and no matter how extensive the scam, the Administration has declared that the financial cops should simply stand by and watch while giant networks of lenders cheat American consumers. This is particularly costly for people whose claims of illegal foreclosures, car repossessions, or debanking are currently under investigation by the agency.

Your efforts to dismantle the CFPB are dangerous, and we will fight them at every turn. We ask that you remove Mr. Musk's operatives from the CFPB, restore all internal and external systems and operations, and allow the CFPB to continue to do its job of protecting American consumers.
